Hello from the Hoffman family,

Sorry for the lateness of the letter, January passed so quickly and it was so full that I got behind on everything, including the prayer letter. But now I'm just making excuses so I'll stop and get to the letter.

January was a good month. It's been encouraging to see people start to get more faithful in their Christian walk. We've had several people that have seemed to turn a corner getting their priorities correct making sure to take the time to come to church and work on their Christian walk. Travis is doing well, and seems like he's really getting closer to God. There are also others that have said and done things showing they are growing in the Lord.

Last Sunday we had something interesting happen at church. The town where the church is has some sort of community walk twice a year. We are never able to figure out what it is because there is never any signs out. There were a few hundred cars parked all over the road, in front of the church and generally everywhere across the entire town. As soon as one car would leave, another one took its place. As we pulled up for Sunday school, we saw there was almost zero parking but we managed to find a spot. I decided right there that the cars in front of the church had to pay some kind of toll for parking where the church people normally park and the payment was going to be a tract on their windshield. We decided not to do Sunday school, instead we all went out and passed out tracts as hundreds of people walked by, if God was going to bring them close to the church, they were going to get a witness! Some of us walked several blocks putting tracts on windshields and door handles while others stood on the side of the road and passed out tracts to the walkers. We have almost entirely wiped out our French tract supply at church. I had to order more yesterday afternoon so we can keep giving them out. The church people loved it. A couple that had missed Sunday school, came later on and told me that they were walking up and saw some tracts thrown on the ground. They picked them up, not knowing what we were doing, and started doing the same thing that we just did. It really made me happy knowing that their natural reaction was to make sure the tracts didn't go to waste and wanted to pass them out as well. I believe that passing out tracts is something they are all getting used to.

Thank you for all you do for us, to help us stay here and be on the mission field. We are so grateful to be one of your missionaries. Your sacrifices are beyond what we deserve and we don't take it lightly. Thank you for allowing us to be a part of your church, we are so blessed and thankful for that.
