Update: We are continuing to work with the Haitian people in Delaware. In the past couple of months, the Lord allowed us to see six Haitians come to the knowledge of salvation. There are three of them I am working with on getting baptized, but they said they are not ready yet. The hardest problem we have with Haitian people is getting them baptized after salvation. Some of them were baptized before they were saved. Their baptism was a good work in order to get to heaven, or they thought water baptism could wash away sins. When you show from the Bible that water baptism has nothing to do with going to heaven but is rather a picture or symbol of the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, it is hard for them to receive the Gospel because they've been to so-called churches that don't preach the Word of God to them. Therefore, I would like to ask you to pray for these Haitians (Esther, Carlens, Yolande, and Kayla) with whom we shared the Gospel and are working with to get baptized. Our prayer is that God can open their eyes to see and understand the truth. For all of 2025, the Lord allowed us to see over 43 salvations and 12 baptisms. Our prayer is to see more souls come to the knowledge of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.



Haiti news:

Haiti is getting worse. There has been no president since 2021. The UN (United Nuts) sent the Kenyan military to Haiti in 2024 to fight gangs, armed with guns, largely shipped in from the United States. Unfortunately, Kenya's mission failed, and the gangs killed 2 Kenyan soldiers and left many of them injured. Their mission in Haiti has concluded, and they returned home in late 2025 after an 18-month deployment.



The gangs have grown their influence over most of the capital and expanded almost all over Haiti in recent years. This has been devastating the economy. Organ trafficking is a big business in Haiti now, along with kidnapping and gang violence. According to U.S. Travel Advisories, Haiti is on Level 4: "Do not travel to Haiti due to kidnapping, crime, terrorist activity, civil unrest."
