We have a special little heater that warms up the water, but when I plugged it in that Saturday, it blew out the power to the whole building and fried the heater. The smoke sizzling from the heater didn't add to my comfort level either. We had no way to heat up the baptistery so I gave Chris two options. 1. Wait until we bought another heater or 2. Get baptized in the freezing water. The crazy kid chose option two, which I was trying desperately to avoid because I'm in the water as well. He got in the water Sunday morning and shivered through it, but he got baptized. He was a Chris-sicle by the time we were done but he was happy, and he loved the extra attention.

February went by very quickly with all the normal church things. We had our 3rd annual chili cook-off and it was very well attended. Joe has been doing his normal witnessing at work and led another coworker, Felix, to the Lord. Felix is from Spain and had rejected Catholicism but he didn't know where to look. Fortunately, God put Joe right there for him. Joe has been picking my brain for all the Spanish books he can send him, so that's a blessing. Hopefully we will see Felix at church soon. His wife is resistant to the thought for now, but we'll keep praying for her!

Thank you for all that you do for us, for the prayers and support. The situation has become rather tense here the last few days, because we are rather close to the Middle East and we have a lot of high-ranking officers in church, so please keep those prayers coming!
